

## CATEGORIES AND INDICATORS

<b>Policy Development (PD)</b>	
PD1	A policy change completed as a result of the grant.
PD2	The number of organizations or communities that demonstrate improved readiness to change their systems in order to implement specific mental health-related practices.
<b>Workforce Development (WD)</b>	
WD1	The number of organizations or communities implementing mental health-related training programs as a result of the grant.
WD2	The number of people in the mental health and related workforce trained in specific mental health-related practices/activities as a result of the grant.
WD3	The number of people credentialed/certified to provide specific mental health-related practices/activities as a result of the grant.
WD4	A change made to a credentialing and licensing policy in order to incorporate expertise needed to improve mental health-related practices/activities as a result of the grant.
WD5	The number of consumers/family members who provide mental health-related services as a result of the grant.
<b>Financing (F)</b>	
F1	The amount of funding for mental health-related practices/activities as a result of the grant.
F2	A change to a financing policy to fund and/or improve mental health-related practices/activities as a result of the grant.
F3	The amount of pooled /blended or braided funding with other organizations used for mental health related practices/activities as a result of the grant.
<b>Organizational Change (OC)</b>	
OC1	An organizational change made to support improvement of mental health-related practices/activities as a result of the grant.
<b>Partnership/Collaborations (PC)</b>	
PC1	The number of organizations that entered into formal written inter/intra-organizational agreements (e.g., MOUs/ MOAs) to improve mental health-related practices/activities as a result of the grant.
PC2	The number of organizations collaborating/coordinating/sharing resources with other organizations as a result of the grant.
<b>Accountability (A)</b>	
A1	The number of organizations making changes to accountability mechanisms in order to improve mental health-related practices/activities as a result of the grant.
A2	The number of organizations that regularly obtain, analyze, and share data on mental health-related results as a result of the grant.
A3	The number of communities with MIS or IT system links across multiple agencies to share service population and service delivery data.
A4	The number and percentage of work group/advisory group/council members who are consumers/family members.
A5	The number of consumers/family members representing consumer/family organizations who are involved in mental health-related planning

	and advocacy activities.
A6	The number of consumers/family members who are involved in mental health-related evaluation oversight, data collection, and/or analysis activities.
<b>Types/Targets of Practices (T)</b>	
T1	The number of specific mental health-related practices/activities implemented as a result of the grant.
T2	The number of programs/organizations/communities utilizing evidence-based mental health-related practices/activities as a result of the grant.
T3	The number of people receiving evidence-based mental health-related services.
T4	The number of programs/organizations/communities implementing adaptations of EBPs that incorporate the special needs of unique populations or settings.
<b>Awareness (AW)</b>	
AW1	The number of individuals exposed to mental health awareness messages.
<b>Training (TR)</b>	
TR1	The number of individuals who have received training in prevention or mental health promotion.
<b>Knowledge/Attitudes/Beliefs (NAB)</b>	
NAB1	The number and percentage of individuals who have demonstrated improvement in knowledge/attitudes/beliefs related to prevention and/or mental health promotion.
<b>Screening (S)</b>	
S1	The number of individuals screened for mental health or related interventions.
<b>Outreach (O)</b>	
O1	The number of individuals contacted through program outreach efforts.
O2	The total number of contacts made through program outreach efforts.
<b>Referral (R)</b>	
R1	The number of individuals referred to mental health or related services.
<b>Access (AC)</b>	
AC1a	The number and percentage of individuals receiving mental health or related services after referral.

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
