Dear Sir or Madam:

Thank you for registering with the Camp Lejeune Historic Drinking Water Notification Database. As you may be aware, the purpose of the Notification Database is to help us notify individuals who may have lived or worked aboard Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune, North Carolina in 1987, or earlier, of potential exposure to contaminated drinking water. We want to ensure those who believe they may have been exposed are provided with up-to-date information regarding the past water quality aboard the base.

The Department of the Navy (DON) funded health studies to determine when the drinking water was first impacted (modeling estimates ~1953), who may have been exposed, and whether there may be any association between exposure and certain health conditions. You may find current information in the Project Updates Section at <https://clnr.hqi.usmc.mil/>. The Camp Lejeune Justice Act (CLJA) of 2022 permitted filing claims and lawsuits related to the historic drinking water, with a claim filing deadline of August 10, 2024. 
